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Emergence uses only the first five notes that are presented in most beginning method books. The meter alternates between 4/4 and 6/8, with the eighth note remaining constant throughout. After a few rehearsals, young students should begin to feel the alternating pattern. This would make a good opener or closer, and is intended for smaller and younger ensembles.

A note about the alternating meter: Because the meter alternates consistently throughout the piece without exception, I chose to omit the meter signatures after the initial signature. This required the 6/8 measures which contained rests to be notated in a way that differentiated them from the 4/4 measures containing whole rests.

The piece is intended to evoke the feeling of the emergence of spring, with the blooming of flowers, budding of leaves, and the singing of birds. It also serves as a metaphor for the budding musicianship that our beginners display at their spring festivals and concerts.
